GIVE five-year-old **Amy Miller** anything with wheels, and her eyes light up.

“She loves cars, she loves trucks – anything that moves, she loves,” mum **Jo** says.

It is just as well seeing as the bubbly Blakeview girl will be

taking part in the Novita Children’s Services CMV Convoy for Kids this weekend (May 25) – the largest charity truck convoy of its type in the world.

Amy, who has been with Novita for almost a year, has multiple disabilities including an intellectual disability, low muscle tone and a neurological

condition. She also suffers from epilepsy and does not talk.

Mrs Miller said doctors had so far been unable to diagnose her condition.

She said the convoy would be a good chance for Amy and the family to get out and meet other families.

“She’s very sociable and very

friendly. I think she’ll get really excited.”

About 300 children will take part in the convoy, which will be held at West Beach. The event is expected to raise more than \$50,000 for Novita, which provides support to children living with a range of disabilities.
