



# New breed of Mack Trucks come to Whyalla

The New Breed of Mack Trucks are set to visit Whyalla as part of a State-wide cavalcade in November.

What started as a redesign of the engine to meet global emission standards quickly evolved in to the largest product redevelopment ever undertaken by Mack.

From headlights being longer, whiter and brighter to axles, suspensions and lowered tare weight being new and improved, the new Mack range is setting the bar in the global truck market.

Anticipated by the heavy truck market for many months, South

Central Trucks Mack dealer Darryl Smith said the New Breed of trucks keep Mack well ahead of the pack in the high horsepower market.

"The engine is probably the most important component of the New Breed trucks," Mr Smith said.

"Not only do they now meet global emission standards, but they are stronger and more powerful than ever."

Exhaustive testing, analysis and real world trials have proven the engine has stronger power and torque curves, with greater throttle response and greater engine braking.

The new Advantage chassis is also part of the New Breed push for a stronger and lower tare weight truck, with the chassis being both 10 per cent stronger and 10 per cent lighter.
